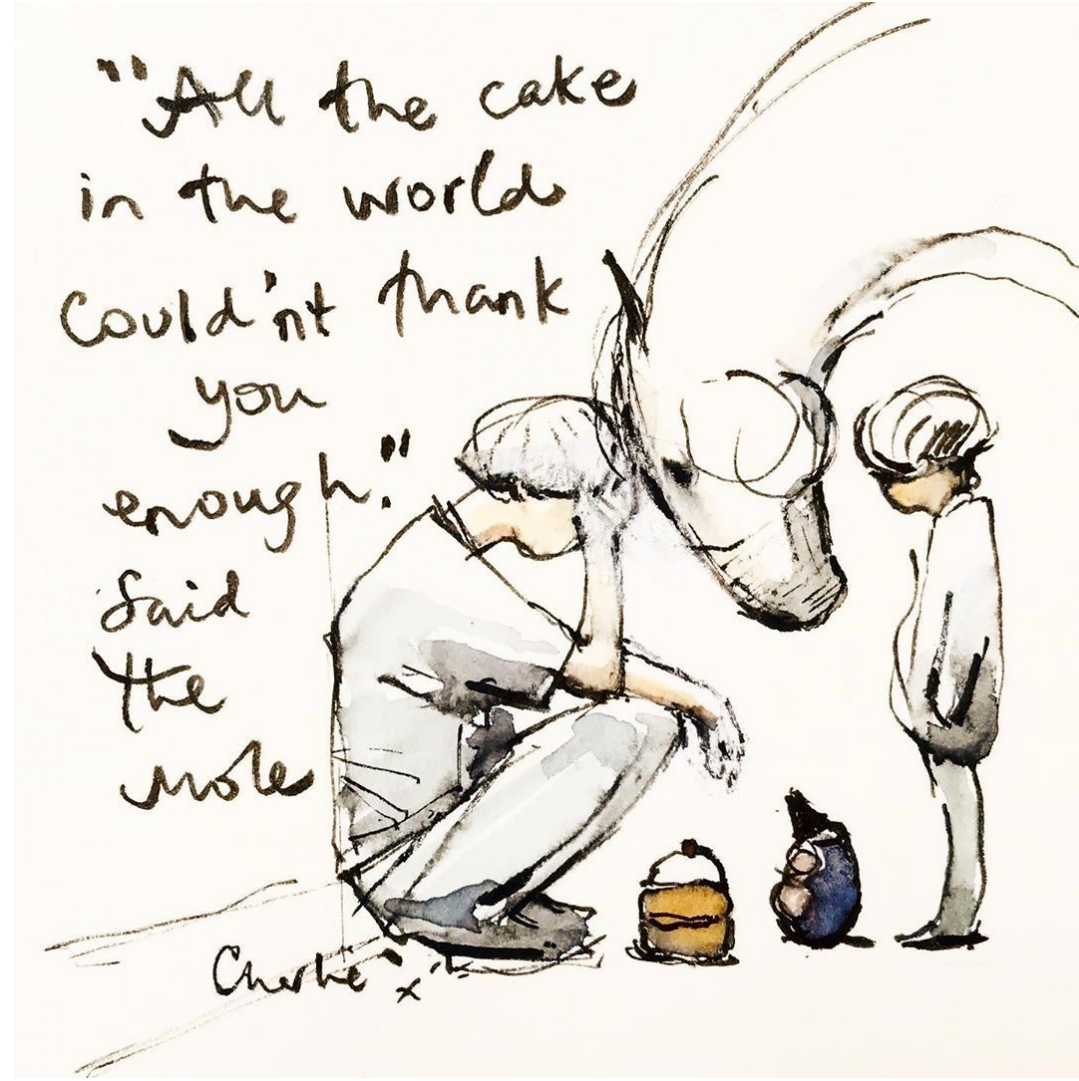

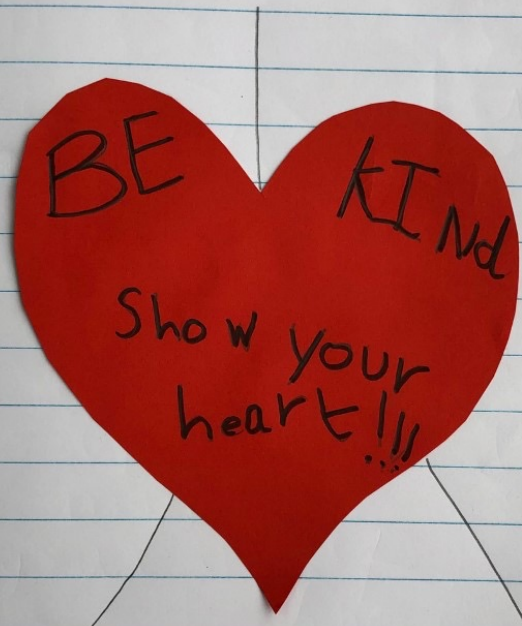

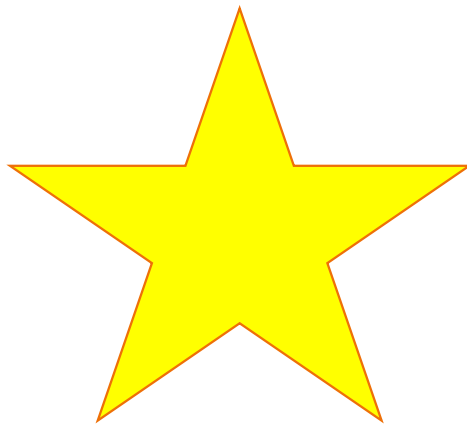

sky. Sailing over hills.

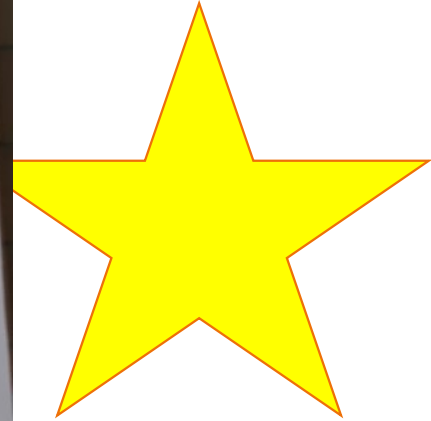

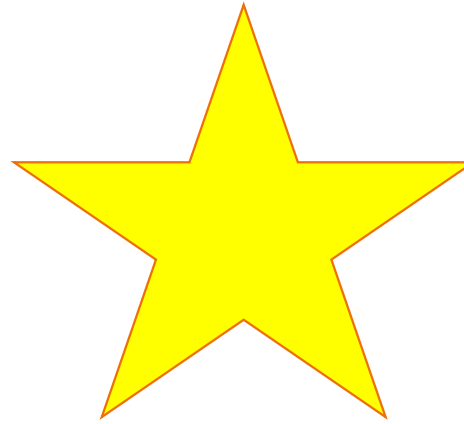


A Cloudy Lesson

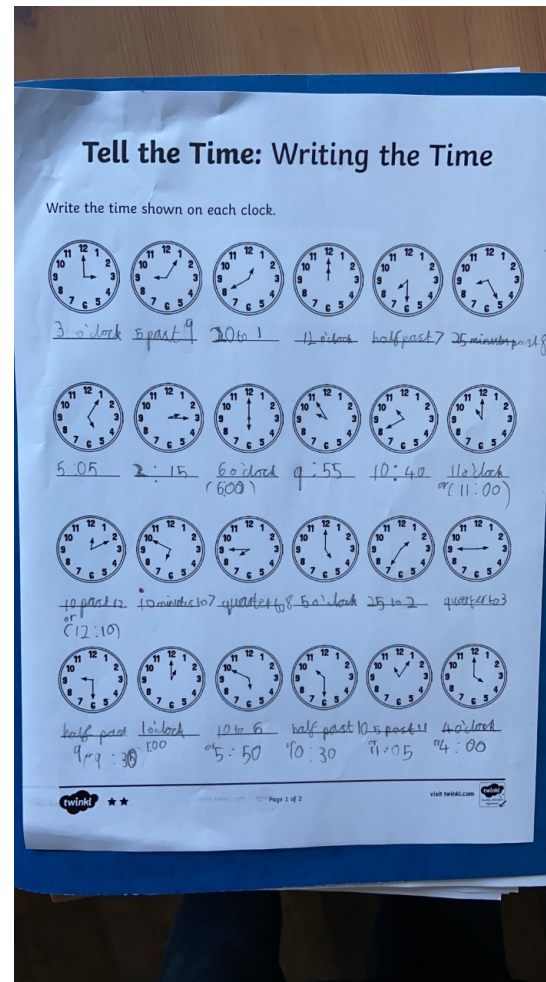
adjectives: graceful, tranquil, calm, fluffy, cottony, bright, gentle, delicate, neve—ending

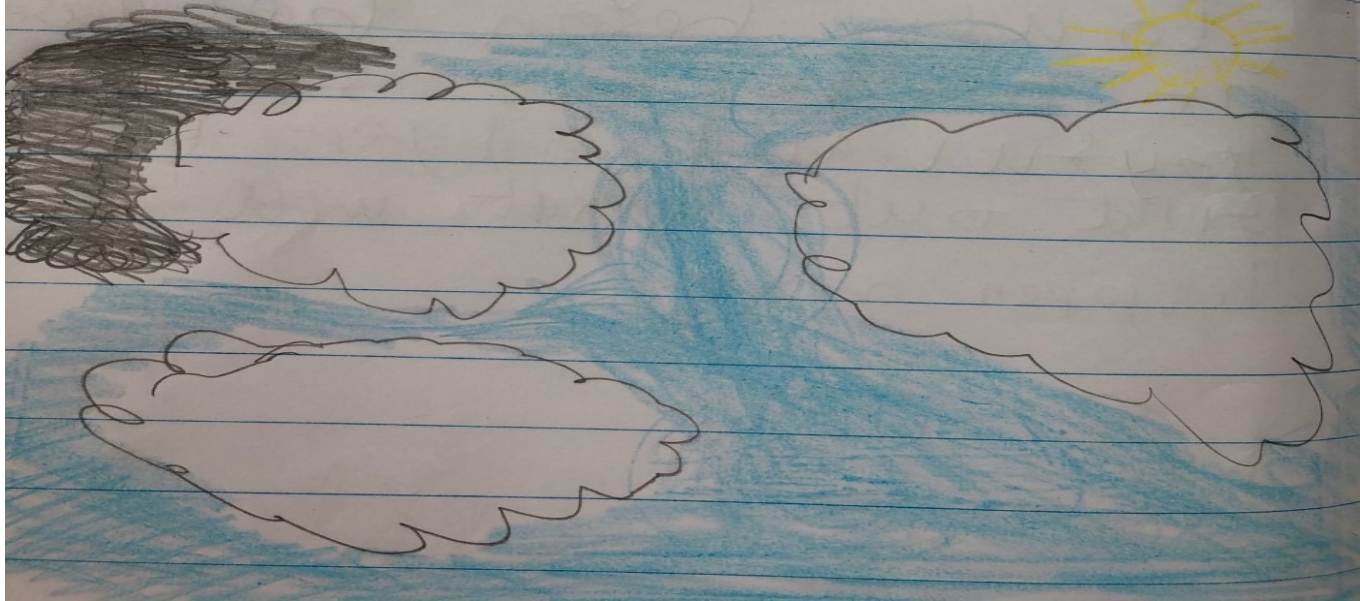

Yikes! Is that a thunder cloud I see?



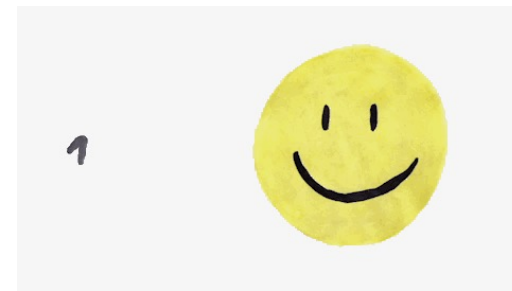
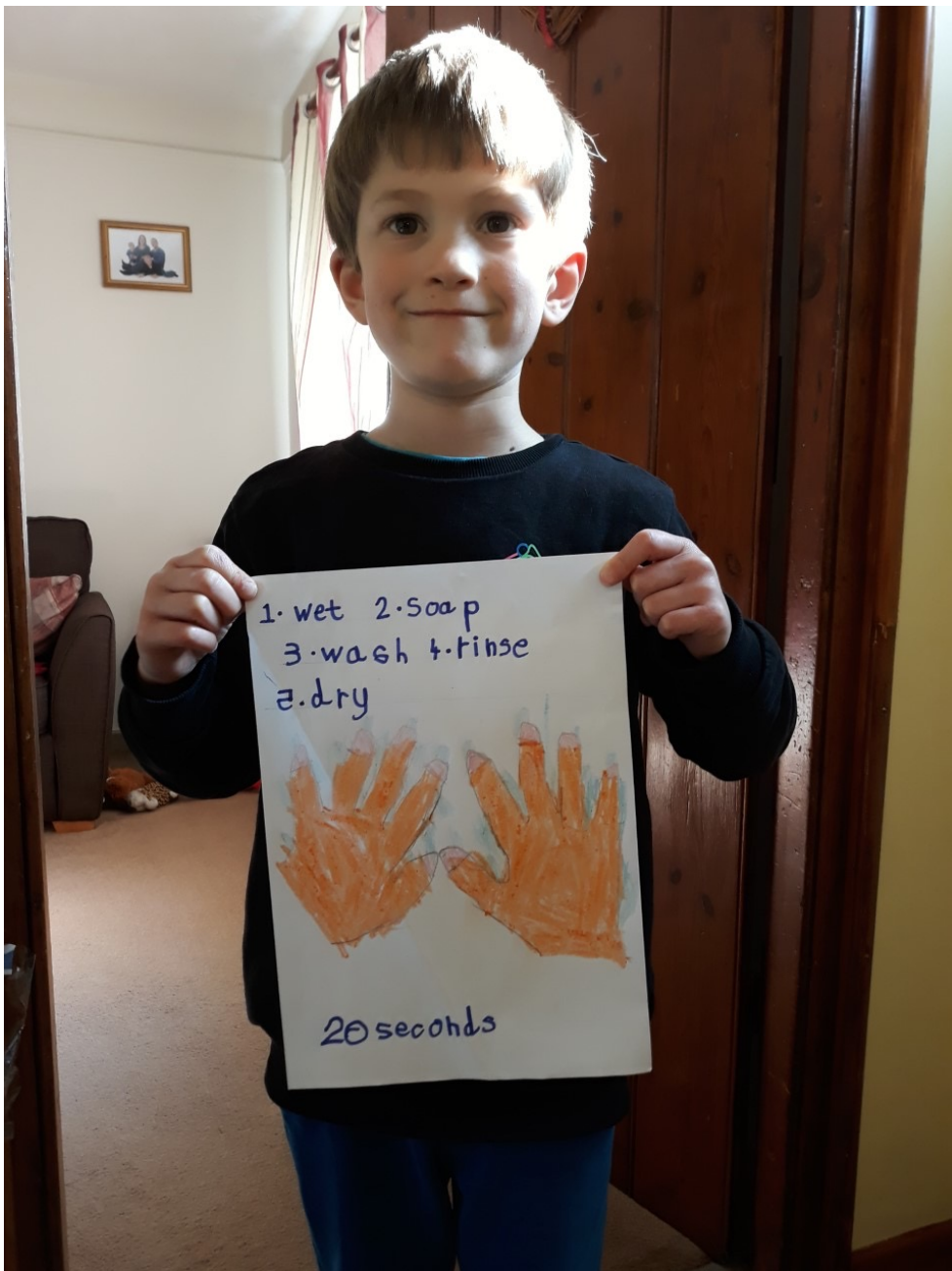
