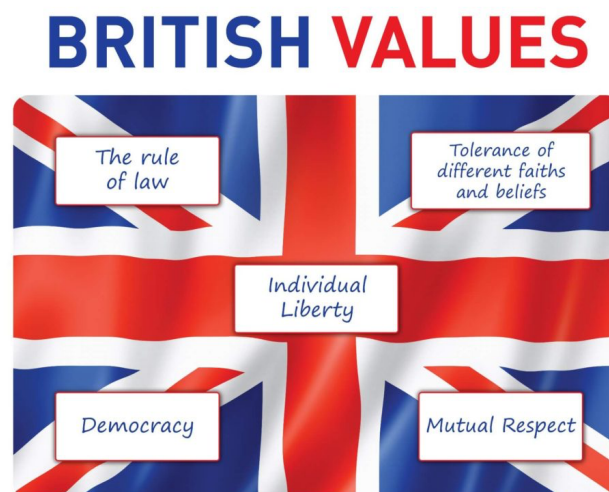


British Values statement 2022.23

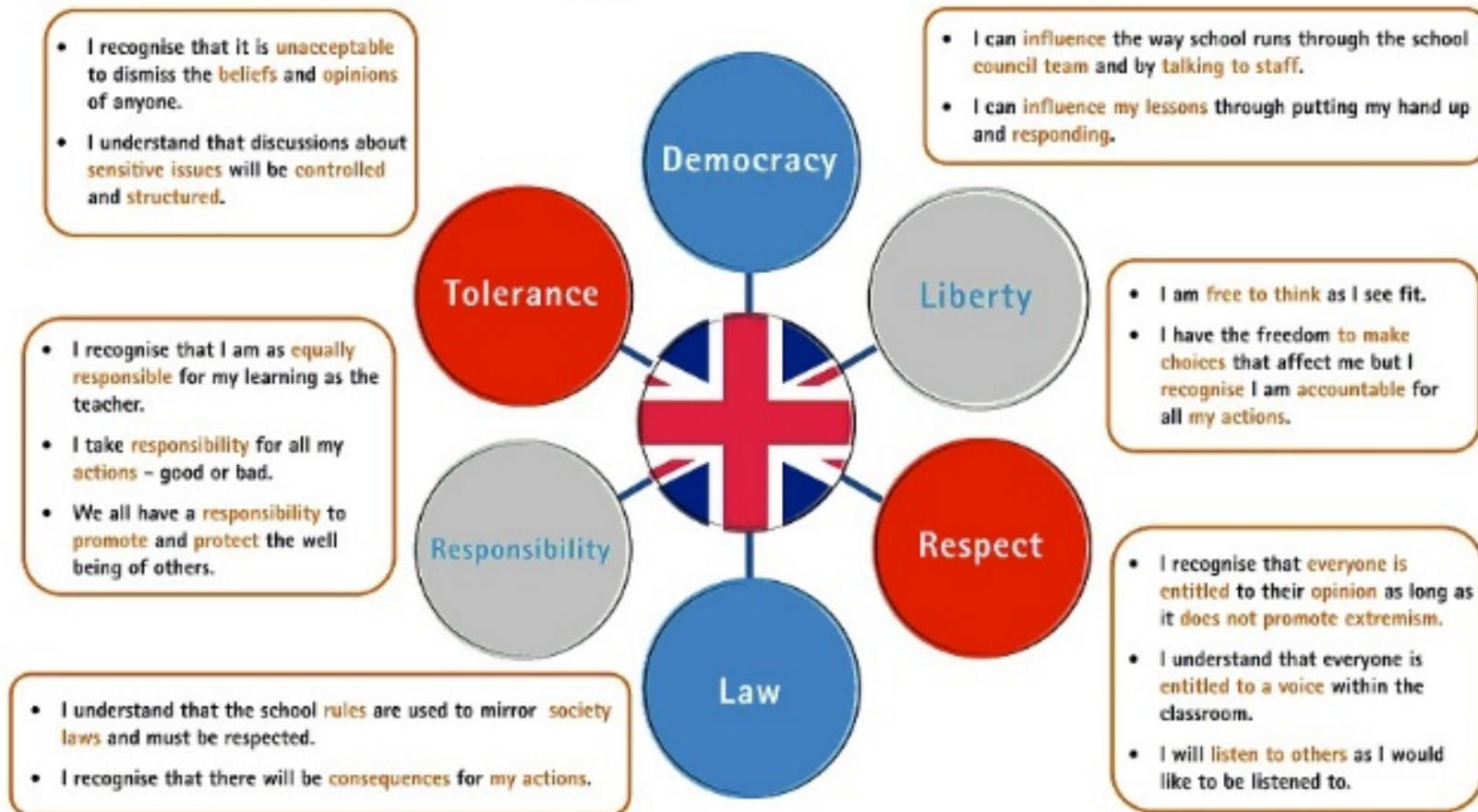
How are British Values embedded in our school?

To distinguish right from wrong and to respect the civil and criminal law of England	Our pupils have a good understanding of the difference between right and wrong, respect tolerance and democracy of the society that they belong to. We have strong Christian values:	Respectful, well behaved, tolerant pupils who strive to serve others.

To accept responsibility for their behaviour, show initiative, and to understand how they can contribute positively to the lives of those living and working in the locality of the school and to society more widely	We are using the UNICEF Resecting Rights resource to shape our class charters. We have a positive behaviour policy which encourages the right choice, every time. Pupils have opportunities to local and international charities through raising funds, foodbank and arranging food and clothing parcels for the refugee crisis.	The UNICEF charter has been embedded into school rules. Pupils have an understanding about responsibility and build on that to improve. Pupils are respectful to each other 97% of children say that pupils behave well at school.
Tolerance and harmony between different cultural traditions. Appreciation for and respect for their own and other cultures	Leaders have created a learning environment in school which promotes British Values through the curriculum.
