Our curriculum and assemblies regularly visit the concept of difference and children understand that every is different and that we thrive as a community together. We focus on our Holistic Picture tool H©P to help understand how a child fits in and has a sense of belonging.

We often have a range of SEND pupils in school that are expertly cared for in their learning by our SENDCo. All vulnerable pupils are given the same oppertunities which means a wholly inclusive environment in which to learn.

- develop pupils' characters, which we define as a set of positive personal traits, dispositions and virtues that informs pupils' motivation and guides their conduct so that they reflect wisely, learn eagerly, behave with integrity and cooperate consistently well with others. - enable pupils to recognise the dangers of inappropriate use of mobile technology and social media
- develop pupils' understanding of how to keep physically healthy, eat healthily and maintain an active lifestyle, including giving ample opportunities for pupils to be active during the school day and through extra-curricular activities

Our whole vision, ethos and values sets out our wish for all pupils to be ready, equipped with a positive energy to embrace the next challenge. Our values are frequently brought into focus to help children make the right choices, think about others, be calm and considered when dealing with the world around them. Pupils are all encouraged to have a go with our "Can do", Proud to be active ethos. We use our Holistic Picture (H©P) to really look at a child's development apart from academic endeavours to tailor our learning for them to succeed.

Our PSHE and general approach to Online and offline safety is clear to all pupils. We know through our safeguarding training, about the risk to all schools, all children despite locations and size.

We are Proud to be Active and this has many aspects in our daily life, Daily Mile for all pupils/every day, PE above the requirement, involvement in local school tournaments and extra-curricular activities for all.
